

#### Movement for the Actor

Discover the way your body can create pictures in space that tell stories to the audience. Control your body, control the story.

### Acting for Stage and Screen

Refine and define even the smallest moments so you become confident, engaging, and unmissable on stage and in the audition room.

#### Theatre in Context

What's the value of contemporary theatre, and what makes it different from other forms? How about dealing with criticism and negative feedback? Learn to recognize your own place in the theatre community and how you can contribute to theatre as a whole.
