As we come closer to realizing our goal for The New Limitless Capital and Endowment Campaign, we are so grateful to our community who share our belief that high-quality arts education should be accessible to all young people.

On March 23, 2018, Arts Umbrella officially launched The New Limitless Campaign with a goal to raise \$27 million in capital to re-purpose our new building, and an additional \$10 million towards an endowment fund to ensure long-term operational sustainability. We are proud to share that we have raised close to \$22 million towards the total building project budget of \$27 million and \$4.2 million towards the endowment fund.

On this building project, we are proud to be collaborating with Vancouver's leading consultants, including Henriquez Partners Architects, BTY Group (Project Management), ITC Construction Management, Integral (Mechanical), Glotman Simpson (Structural), Nemetz (Electrical), DWD (Theatre Design), and BKL (Acoustical Design).

In March 2019, Arts Umbrella received building permitting, and internal demolition was completed in June 2019. We are currently scheduled to complete construction in Summer 2020, with the grand opening slated for Fall 2020.

Thank you for joining us on this journey as we imagine the future of arts education for young people in Canada. Your leadership and support will create tremendous opportunities for children and youth, and together, we will ensure arts education for young people is accessible for generations to come.

New Scholarship Initiatives

This year we announced two new major scholarship programs, **Creative Launchpad** and the **McCall MacBain Cultural Leadership Award**, both aimed at post-secondary students looking to pursue careers and opportunities in the arts.

Creative Launchpad is a scholarship program created by Vancouver philanthropists Jeff Mooney and Suzanne Bolton. Its mandate is to support youth in pursuing their academic and career passions. Arts Umbrella is honoured to deliver this scholarship fund, which will dedicate \$75,000 annually to students who are pursuing post-secondary programs in the arts and creative sector.

The McCall MacBain Cultural Leadership Award was created in partnership with the McCall MacBain Foundation. Each year, funding is awarded to 4-5 students in the Arts Umbrella Post-Secondary Dance Program who exemplify dedication to the dance community, artistic expression, and a commitment to the development of Canada's cultural sector. The funding—up to \$15,000 per recipient—will provide both financial security and mentorship opportunities.

Shaw Creative Journeys Program

This past year at Arts Umbrella Granville Island and South Surrey, entire classes of students in grades 1-7 experienced the joy of creativity. The Shaw Creative Journeys Program invited over 1,200 students to expand their horizons and experience success through learning new skills while working on stimulating projects.

Delivered on site at Arts Umbrella, the program provides schools in the Greater Vancouver community with a full-day field trip experience offered free of charge, with priority given to schools who lack a strong arts program.

In the program, students spend a full day exploring visual arts, theatre, and media arts activities, inspired by Arts Umbrella artist-instructors. It offers young people a unique opportunity to leave their regular surroundings and exposes them to new ideas and dialogue in a creative setting.

This extraordinary initiative has grown into one of Arts Umbrella’s signature community programs, in high demand from local schools. With an 18-year history, we are so pleased to welcome Shaw as our new title sponsor. We look forward to many more years of bringing young people from across Metro Vancouver into our studios, and nurturing their curiosity, creativity, and confidence.

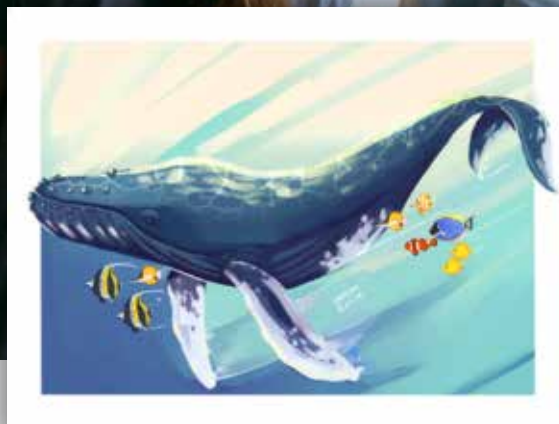

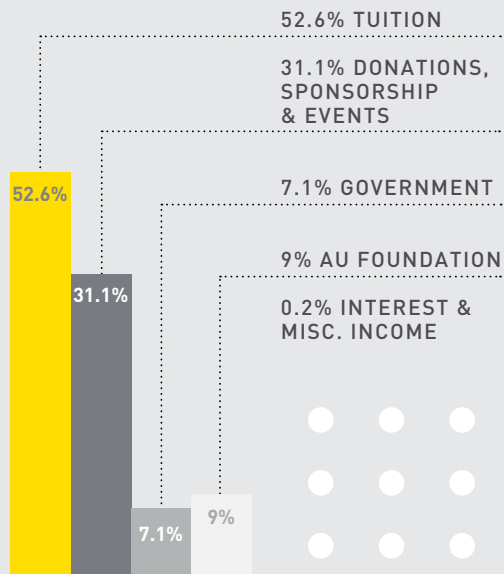

For the years ended August 31, 2018 and 2019

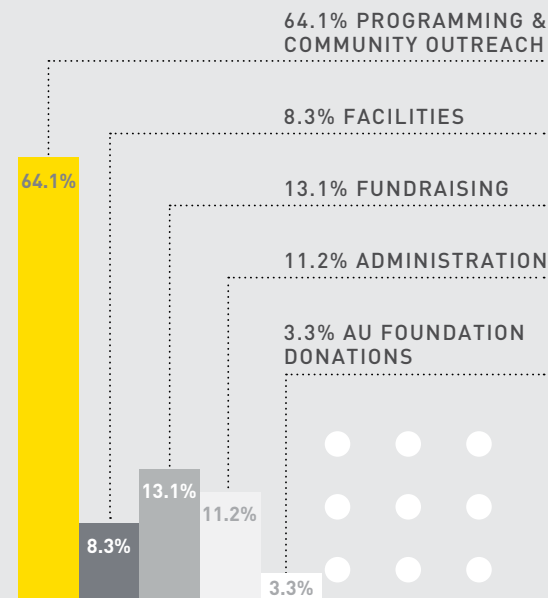
REVENUES 2018

Total Revenue \$7,242,542



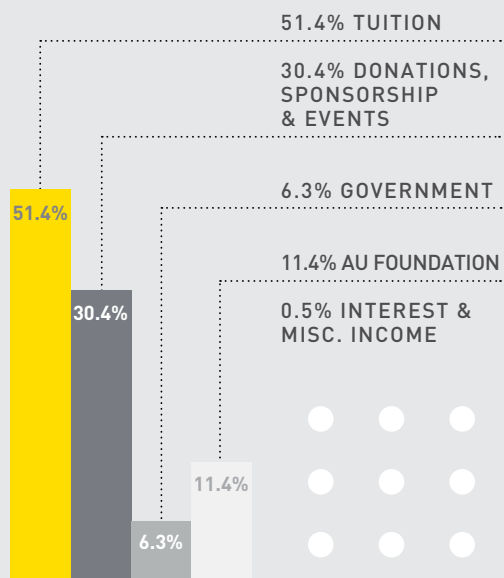
EXPENDITURES 2018

Total Revenue \$7,180,610



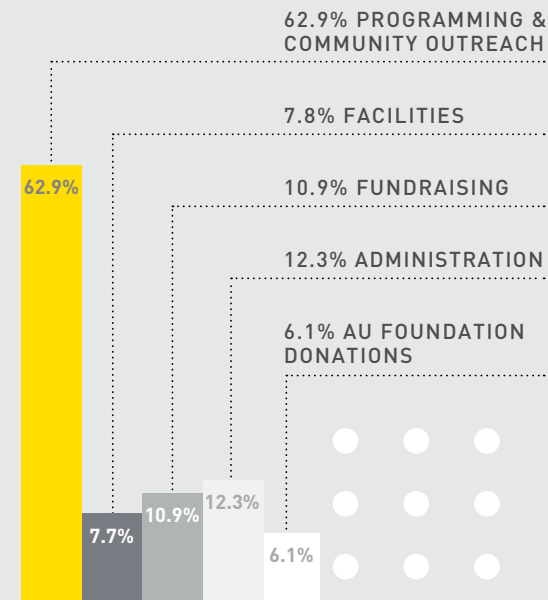
REVENUES 2019
