



ABOUT ARTS UMBRELLA

Arts Umbrella is where young artists ages 2–22 cultivate their creativity in Dance, Theatre, and Art & Design. As a non-profit centre for arts education, we believe that art is powerful. Powerful enough to change childrens' lives in incredible ways. When young people connect with the arts, they gain self-confidence, develop self-discipline, and discover creative expression—qualities they carry with them for life.

Arts Umbrella has four locations in Vancouver and Surrey, as well as donor-funded programs at schools, community centres, neighbourhood houses, and healthcare facilities across Metro Vancouver. We reach more than 24,000 students every year, with nearly 81% participating at little to no cost.

Our Story

In 1979 Arts Umbrella opened its doors to 45 children. It was an endeavour buoyed by the dream of five passionate artists and parents concerned about the lack of arts education available to young people in Metro Vancouver. Their dream was to instill in all children a love of the arts—to inspire young people to become confident, creative, and compassionate citizens.

In the early years, the founders were involved at every level of the organization—from instruction and administration, to fundraising and sitting on the Board of Directors. While the first classes in visual and performing arts were held in a borrowed space, the need for a permanent location was soon recognized. By 1983, Arts Umbrella moved into their new home on Granville Island—a converted 1930s nail factory—and began fundraising for renovations. Over the past 40 years, Arts Umbrella has continued to grow as demand for high-quality, accessible arts education rose across Metro Vancouver. In 2020, Arts Umbrella will move into its new home on Granville Island, in the South Building of the former Emily Carr University of Art & Design.

Access to the arts has always been a cornerstone of Arts Umbrella co-founder Carol Henriquez' vision. Bursaries and community programs were early initiatives to ensure that all young people, regardless of economic or social circumstance, were provided with the opportunity to access a high-quality arts education. Today, Arts Umbrella staff work tirelessly to ensure that access to an arts education remains a cornerstone of what we do.

HOW WE WORK

Paid Programs

Arts Umbrella offers tuition-based programs at our locations on Granville Island, South Surrey, and Surrey Centre. These programs in Art & Design, Dance, and Theatre & Music follow a rich curriculum based on arts education principles, with offerings in Sessional (Fall, Winter, and Spring) Terms, as well as intensive and pre-professional year-long programs.

Bursaries

Arts Umbrella believes that finances should never prevent a child from participating in the arts. As a non-profit organization, Arts Umbrella is committed to making our programming accessible to as many children and youth in our communities as possible. Our bursaries allow hundreds of children to register in tuition-based programs at a reduced rate, based on financial need.

Applications for bursary funding are open to everyone. Eligibility and submission details, as well as applications, are available to download from the Arts Umbrella website, and all applications are held in confidence.

Northern Arts Connection

Arts Umbrella is partnered with Toronto-based TakingITGlobal in the delivery of an acclaimed program called Connected North, which provides participating schools with access to engaging and innovative virtual content. Northern Arts Connection provides schools in remote Canadian communities with access to high-quality arts education, engaging some of Canada's most under-served children and youth in visual arts and performing arts workshops and performances.

Scholarships

Arts Umbrella offers a number of scholarship-based programs, funded by donors and created in partnership with organizations such as the Vancouver Art Gallery, the Contemporary Art Gallery, BTY Group, and Electronic Arts. Students must apply to our scholarship programs, and successful candidates are selected based on demonstrated skill, passion, and commitment.

Additionally, Arts Umbrella provides merit-based scholarships to students on an annual basis, based on instructor recommendations.

Donor-Funded Community Programs

For many children, Arts Umbrella is their first experience with the world of art. Our donor-funded community programs harness Arts Umbrella magic and expertise, and bring free-of-charge, high-quality arts classes to the young people across Metro Vancouver who would benefit from it most.


PROGRAM INFORMATION

Overview

Arts Umbrella classes are based on arts education principles that seek to engage and foster the whole child. Programs and workshops are led by more than 250 industry experts, practicing artists, and specialized educators. From early childhood education to professional-level programs, Arts Umbrella is committed to providing young people with the best possible arts education.

Arts Umbrella has developed programs with a number of established and reputable community partners, including Ballet BC, Bard on the Beach, BTY Group, Capture Photography Festival, the Contemporary Art Gallery, the Vancouver Art Gallery, Electronic Arts, BC Children's Hospital, Ronald McDonald House, Microsoft, and more.





Dance

Arts Umbrella Dance is a rigorous program designed for dancers ages 6-22. From the General Program to our Pre-Professional Training and Post-Secondary Programs, the excellence and innovation of Arts Umbrella Dance permeates everything we do. The curriculum balances physical development with emotional and intellectual growth, providing a life-changing dance education that has impact long after graduation.

Theatre, Music & Film

Arts Umbrella Theatre & Music programs nurture young performers' creativity and build skills that will benefit them on the stage and in everyday life. The curriculum explores collaborative and solo acting exercises, as well as the technical aspects of theatre and film, like lighting, sound, and costume and set design. Additional programs in writing and directing expand students knowledge in the theatre and film industries.

THE NEW LIMITLESS CAMPAIGN

In 2020, Arts Umbrella will open the doors to its new 50,000 net-square-foot home in the iconic South Building of the former Emily Carr University of Art + Design on Granville Island. The facility more than doubles our current square footage, significantly increasing our capacity to serve young people throughout Metro Vancouver and across the province.

This transformative project is made possible through historic funding from the Department of Canadian Heritage and major support from the Province of BC and the City of Vancouver.

The tremendous support from all levels of government, together with lead support from the private sector, will ensure Arts Umbrella can expand its mission to be Canada's leader in arts education for young people.

Building Information

LOCATION AND SIZE

- Street Address: 1400 Johnston Street, Granville Island
- Arts Umbrella's new home will be 50,000 net-square-feet
- Arts Umbrella projects that within 3–5 years, the new facility will welcome 15,000 young people each year, in addition to students reached in Surrey and extensive donor-funded community programs throughout Metro Vancouver.

ARCHITECTURE AND DESIGN

Honouring the original design by Patkau Architects, the initial schematic to repurpose the building has been completed by award-winning architecture firm Henriquez Partners Architects (HPA).

HPA previously worked with Arts Umbrella on three projects:

- 1992: building repurposing at 1418 Cartwright Street—from an industrial factory space
- 1990: building renovation at 1418 Cartwright Street
- 2000: building expansion at 1418 Cartwright Street

TIMELINE

- Initial planning and seed investment complete
- March 2018: final design development, building code consultation, electrical, mechanical, structural engineering consultation.
- January 2019: construction and renovations began
- Winter 2021: New facility opens

FACILITIES

- 6 Dance studios designed to suit dancers of all ages and experience.
- 4 Theatre & Music studios with specialized technical and audio equipment that support multi-media applications.
- 10 Art & Design studios, including state-of-the-art media labs, a darkroom for photography, and two kilns for ceramics.
- A 132-seat professional theatre open to Vancouver's arts community.
- A publicly accessible exhibition space to showcase the works of students and visiting artists.
- New workshop spaces for woodworking, stagecraft building, and general fabrication will enhance our capacity to train professionals for the industry.
