A New Home for Arts Education

In April 2021, Arts Umbrella opened the doors to our new home on Granville Island.

This 50,000 net-square-foot facility features six spacious dance studios; four theatre, music, and film studios with specialized technical and audio equipment; 10 art and design studios, including media labs and a photography darkroom; a 132-seat theatre; a public exhibition space; and a dedicated area for stagecraft, including woodworking and general fabrication.

The opportunities provided to us by these new spaces are limitless, including the possibility to bring even more members of the community into the building on a regular basis. State-of-the-art studios specific to each discipline allow instructors to teach to their fullest potential and dream big about new programs for the coming years.

By 2026, our new building is expected to serve 15,000 children and youth every year through tuition-based programs and performances, as well as donor-funded community programs, distance learning, bursaries, and scholarships. Our classes, workshops, and performances will continue to remove the geographic, cultural, social, and financial barriers that can prevent young people from accessing the arts.

Making a Difference in Our Community

As a result of COVID-19, and the associated safety restrictions that took place, we experienced a 37% decrease in the number of students served over last year. In spite of these challenges, we are proud to have served 10,114 children and youth in 2020/2021, 63% of which were engaged in donor-funded Arts Umbrella programming (community programs, bursaries, and scholarships).

Over the course of the year, 13 donor-funded community programs in 97 community partner locations (schools, community centres, daycares, etc.) served 6,052 children and youth. A total of 339 bursaries and scholarships were disbursed for students to remove financial barriers and allow them to participate in classes and programs at our Vancouver and Surrey facilities.



HINDSIGHT

Generously supported by **iA Financial Group** and the **Taylor Taliesin Foundation**, Hindsight launched in partnership with **DIVERSEcity**. A solo performance project for youth ages 15-19, Hindsight was designed to provide IBPOC (Indigenous, Black, and People of Colour) students a space to explore the craft of theatre and performance writing, with the intention of sharing their stories.

Instructed by Matt Clarke, Paneet Singh, and Jiejun Wu, Hindsight ran for seven weeks in Fall 2020 and continued into Winter 2021 for another nine weeks. In the Fall, students gathered for an hour each week to workshop and write, learning aspects of solo performance creation such as story structure and character development. In the Winter session, students learned to take their work from page to stage.

BMO VAN GO & STAGE COACH PROGRAM

The **BMO Van Go & Stage Coach Program** is Arts Umbrella's largest and longest-running community program, reaching more than 100,000 children over three decades. Each year, our workshops engage approximately 3,500 children in grades K-7 who may not otherwise have the ability to participate in theatre and visual arts classes.

Instructed by Andre Seow, Jamie Hume, Sarah Hoemberg, and Niki Sampson, the BMO Van Go Program ran in-person in the Richmond school district for Fall 2020 before moving fully online for Winter and Spring 2021. Art supplies were dropped off and picked up each week with Arts Umbrella staff delivering lessons online to individual classrooms. The theme of this year's workshops was *Birds of BC*, addressing concepts of diversity and environmental sustainability.

The BMO Stage Coach Program ran for Winter and Spring 2021 with staff delivering lessons to schools online. Instructed by Terri-Lyn Storey, Karen Worrod, Erika Babins, Seamus Fera, and Francis Dowlatabadi, the workshops used theatre games to explore the concept of adaptation, including communicating and reacting to changing circumstances. The online format of this program meant a further reach than in past years, even garnering interest from outside the Lower Mainland.

CREATIVE ARTS

Our Creative Arts program, offered at both BC Children's Hospital and Ronald McDonald House, empowers children and youth to find their creative voice, no matter their life circumstances.

Creative Arts is offered free-of-charge, due to the generosity of our community partners and donors including **Dave and Pamela Richardson, TD Bank Group, the Pacific Blue Cross Health Foundation, and Stephanie Carlson.**

Ronald McDonald House BC & Yukon offers accommodation to families who have a child battling serious illness and require lengthy out-of-town hospitalization.

Many of these young people have compromised immune systems, making in-person Creative Arts sessions especially dangerous during the COVID-19 pandemic, therefore, families have been offered the opportunity to engage in a variety of visual art activities online since Fall 2020. We continued to offer these live, two-hour sessions once-a-week until the end of June 2021.

We are so proud of our work with these children and teens. They have learned to use the visual arts as distraction, as medicine, and as inspiration.

Our partners at BC Children's Hospital confirmed their desire to participate virtually from April until June 2021, which saw outstanding results. Stress, fear, grief, isolation, and uncertainty created by the COVID-19 pandemic amplified mental health struggles young people were already navigating. This motivated Arts Umbrella staff to quickly pivot our Creative Arts program to an online offering, hoping to subside any additional worry and give program participants something to look forward to each week.

Instructed by Jamie Hume, children ages 8-19 in the Eating Disorders In-Patient Program gathered online once a week to explore and to create. Distinct from art therapy, the Creative Arts program is a time where patients utilize imagination and creativity as a way to restore their energy.

PROSPERA ARTFUL PROGRAMS

Generously funded by **Prospera Credit Union**, Prospera Artful Programs offer young people access to arts education in their community. Prospera Artful Programs are comprised of a weekly Parent & Me visual arts class (ages 3-5) as well as Artful Afternoons programming in both visual arts and theatre in partnership with three local Surrey schools.

Delivered out of our Surrey Centre location, classes were instructed by Corey Schmitt, Alexandra Quispe, and Argel Monte de Ramos (Theatre), and Netsanet Tsegaye, Oksana Slonevskaya, and Claudine Paed (Visual Arts).

Many students who participate in Prospera Artful Programs would not otherwise get the opportunity to participate in extra-curricular activities due to barriers around funding and transportation. Programs such as these are essential to leveling the playing field by providing access to these students.

2021 SUMMER CAMPS

We were thrilled to have Canadian accessory and lifestyle brand **Herschel Supply Co.** partner with us this past year. Herschel believes in supporting local youth as well as creative education, therefore they stepped up to offer a product to every single student who attended our 2021 Summer Camps.



ARCHITECTURE SUMMER INTENSIVE

Arts Umbrella's one-week Architecture Summer Intensive, presented by **BTY Group**, provides teens ages 15-19 with the rare opportunity to work with some of Metro Vancouver's most innovative architects, planners, and educators. The Intensive also collaborates with **Urbanarium** to give participants a chance to create local industry connections and gain a deeper understanding of the discipline.

Instructed by Graham Smith and Netsanet Tsegaye, the 2021 Intensive ran August 9-13, with 10 students safely back in studio. Students were encouraged to explore environmentally and civically-minded design practices, working to imagine the development of a City Square to be placed in the empty lot beneath the Northeast False Creek viaduct.

The final exhibition, which took place in the Cassils | Henriquez Exhibition Gallery, was attended by students, their families, AU faculty, staff, and guest speakers including our community partners at Urbanarium, the Black and Indigenous Design Collective, Atelier Anonymous, Happy City, and Richard Henriquez.

INTERNATIONAL SUMMER DANCE INTENSIVE 2021

Each summer, world-renowned teachers, choreographers, and repetiteurs join Arts Umbrella faculty to offer a dance experience helping young artists reach their performance potential, in our International Summer Dance Intensive (ISDI). ISDI 2021 was one to remember, as it was the first in our new studios.

Over the past two years, with support from the **Cultural and Scientific Service of the Embassy of France to Canada**, we have been honoured to invite renowned instructors, such as Yvan Dubreuil, to teach movement research and improvisation classes and lead discussions with 70 of our student dance artists. In 2021, our innovative online class format demonstrated resilience in the face of the pandemic, allowing Arts Umbrella to reach dance students around the world, in spite of international travel restrictions.

EA TEEN ANIMATION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Since 2001, **Electronic Arts** and Arts Umbrella have been inspiring and educating the gaming artists and animators of tomorrow in our Electronic Arts Teen Animation Scholarship Program.

Each January, Arts Umbrella welcomes 10 students ages 15-19 who are keen to stretch their artistic boundaries to participate in an intensive, mentor-based media arts learning experience. By the end of the 15-week program, participants have a portfolio piece for post-secondary applications which is shared in a showcase of the students' work. To date, over 200 students have participated and a large number of graduates have pursued animation, media arts, and gaming in their post-secondary studies and careers.

Our 2021 EA Teen Animation Scholarship Program was delivered solely online and was instructed by Jay Lyonns and Niki Sampson. Guest speakers included EA animator Paul Baruzzi and animator/director Kris Pearn. Due to the ongoing pandemic, the 2021 showcase remained in its online format first launched in 2020, with students receiving treat packages hand-delivered to their home with a yearbook, letter of completion, and a choice of two EA Games to download and enjoy.

ARTEMIS GORDON: CELEBRATING 30 YEARS AT ARTS UMBRELLA

An artistic and pedagogical authority in dance, Artemis Gordon was named Artistic Director of Arts Umbrella Dance in 1992. Since then, she has developed the program's international recognition. Artemis has toured the Arts Umbrella Dance Company to Europe, Asia, and the United States, and fostered collaborations with companies around the world.

In 2015, Artemis secured an affiliation with Ballet BC, increasing opportunities for emerging artists and amplifying the impact of international choreographers in Vancouver. In 2016, Artemis won the YWCA Women of Distinction award in the Arts, Culture, and Design category. She was also awarded with the 2017 City of Vancouver Mayor's Arts Awards in Dance.

LYNN SHEPPARD: CELEBRATING 25 YEARS AT ARTS UMBRELLA

Lynn has guided dance artists in the Professional Training Program at Arts Umbrella since 1996. As a professional dancer, Lynn worked with renowned companies such as Les Ballets Jazz de Montreal, Hubbard Street Dance Chicago, Judith Marcuse's Repertory Dance Company, and JOE INK. As an educator, Lynn shares her experiences with unmatched energy, enthusiasm, wit and wisdom.

Splash Sets New Record With Innovative Model

For 38 years, Arts Umbrella has connected guests with acclaimed artists from BC and beyond at our annual **Splash Art Auction & Gala**, presented by Nicola Wealth.

Our flagship fundraiser welcomed more than 700 art aficionados, patrons, creatives, and business and community leaders online and at six venues across the city. A record-breaking \$1.1M was raised to fund accessible arts education for young people.

This year, while many events and gatherings were forced to cancel or close due to COVID-19, we found a creative way to pivot the signature art auction and gala to a first-of-its-kind alternative.

Co-Chaired by Christie Garofalo and Bruce Munro Wright, Splash - Special 2020 Edition was hosted at multiple venues across Vancouver, each welcoming a maximum of 50 people, as per provincial government and health official guidelines. Each venue was connected through digital screens that broadcasted the live auction and

evening's entertainment not only to in-person attendees, but also to more than 500 guests who attended online at home.

In advance of the live event, guests and the public could browse and place bids on original artworks donated by 94 contributing artists including Douglas Coupland, Dana Claxton, Andrew Dadson and Angela Grossmann. The live event, emceed by Fred Lee and CBC news personality Gloria Macarenko, brought the live auction experience to guests at venues and at home alike, with auctioneer Hank Bull presiding over the historic Live Auction.

**ARTIST HIGHLIGHT:
DON YEOMANS**

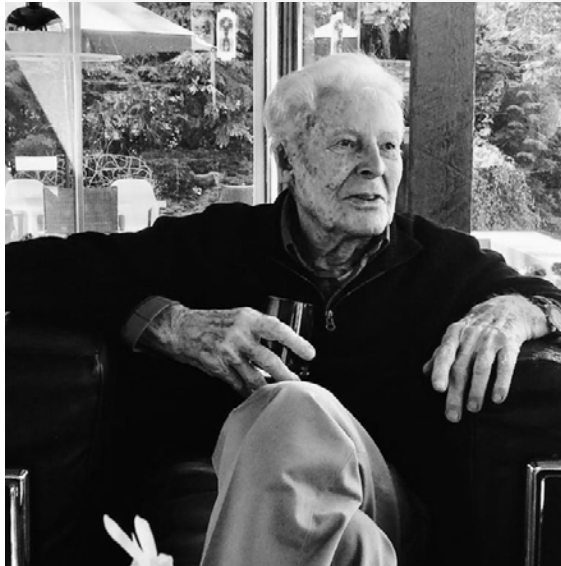
Haida artist Don Yeomans is a leading figure of contemporary Northwest Coast art. He started his career with the most recognized master artists of the 20th century, apprenticing for his aunt Freda Diesing and the eminent Bill Reid. Over the decades, Yeomans' work has been part of the most important shows of Haida art and acquired by the highest calibre public and private collections.

Yeomans' 2020 Splash contribution, *Eagle Frog* (2018), helped raise funds for the Arts Umbrella Bursary Fund, ensuring that access to an arts education is available to all young people, regardless of socio-economic circumstance.

With this specific work, the contemporary take on the repeating eagle and frog design shows Yeomans' understanding and ability to innovate through art while still working within the bounds of the Haida tradition.

A lifelong supporter of the Vancouver arts community and children's causes, Jud was an exceptional craftsman and a force for good, whose kindness and humour will be greatly missed.

The entire Arts Umbrella community will forever treasure Gordon and Jud's friendship, generosity, and humanity.
