





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A NOTE FROM THE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR, THEATRE, MUSIC & FILM

When is it better to hold on and when to let go? How do you want to spend your life? These questions unfold around Winnie in this musical adaptation of Natalie Babbitt's beloved children's novel.

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Time is a funny thing. Two weeks of vacation can whiz by; an hour stuck in traffic can slog on and on. How fitting to be exploring this fable of time, and what it means to have too much or too little of it, during this period when many folks have said time has lost all meaning.

I am so proud of work these young artists have done with this piece. They've brought thoughtful questions to the table about the world and their characters, which has created a rich tapestry for the residents of and visitors to Treegap, New Hampshire. Together, we've explored what it would mean to live forever, stuck in time exactly how we are now. I'm happy their consensus was that in order to live a fulfilling live we "can't stop rowing, growing, changing, and moving on". (And that being stuck as a teenager forever would be a nightmare!)

Kindness offers an unforgettable lesson in compassion and listening to one another. It sensitively captures the reality of childrens' feelings, telling the story of three kids, Tessa, Damon and Keegan, as they navigate the small and large catastrophes in their lives. Mr. Foon spent a week interviewing kids in five Winnipeg schools about what mattered to them. "What struck me was that no matter what their difficulties—and some were huge—many of these kids had enormous compassion for each other and the world around them. Some showed it by supporting a friend in need, others had begun fundraising efforts for worthy causes. These kids, barely alive a dozen years, got me thinking about those empty spaces—and how all of us need to find ways to fill them

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

When I found out I was taking over as Director of Junior Troupe, I knew I needed to find a script that would engage and excite the young audience but also resonate with the young performers. We have all been living through a wild ride of world events, so I knew that we needed to find a piece that reflected that experience. I also knew that highlighting Canadian theatre was imperative in order to help the students understand the scope of our own art. Enter Dennis Foon, a titan of Canadian Theatre for Young Audiences. Years ago, a colleague introduced me to Tessa, Keegan, and the world of Kindness, and presto, I knew which script would launch my tenure. Then, when the floods across British Columbia happened, it felt even more important that we bring this work to audiences. I am truly indebted to the eight students who made this year so fun and to my amazing assistant Laura who keeps me on track. Most importantly, a thank you to the one and only Susanne Moniz de Sá for the legacy of love, passion and joy she trusted to me.

This time has been truly heavy on our young people.
Sure, a young person's life has always had its share of
uncertainty. But this particular time feels different; there
seems a gravity to growing up in our time that I don't
remember feeling as a kid. I found myself asking these
questions: What kind of programming suits this time?
What kind of show do people want to see when we are busy
coming out of but not really coming out of a pandemic?
What kind of show do people need?

A better question: Who lives in a pineapple under the sea?

This is a silly story about a simple sponge. An irrepressibly light-hearted individual who's just trying to make their mark. It's also a story about belonging, about friendship, and about doing what we can to save the people and places that we love. The circumstances in the show are dire, but the characters - these beautiful actors, in fact - create these moments with such play and irreverence that I could walk away from each rehearsal with a smile on my face and joy in my heart.

Every week, these brilliant humans confirmed it. SpongeBob is the show I needed to see. I hope you feel the same way.



In the Lion King, Simba discovers what it means to be responsible for someone other than himself, to take care of his family and his people as a whole when he finally steps into his role as King of Pride Rock. This struggle to care for others while simultaneously going through your own personal struggles is something achingly familiar as we navigated the ever changing landscape of the past two years.

Was it ambitious to tell this sprawling tale with only seven actors? Sure.

Did they rise to the challenge to tell a creative and engaging story full of humor and heart? You bet.

DIRECTOR'S NOTES



DIRECTOR'S NOTES

We play a game called Look What I Got You where one player steps into the circle, faces another player, holds out a nondescript object in space, and says "Look what I got you!" The player who is receiving the object then declares what it is by saying "Wow, a -" blender or a pony or a bowtie or a sushi roll or a baseball stadium or a pickle jar, etc. The original player builds on that and explores further, "Well I know how you like to make smoothies every morning..." then the new player transforms the gift and presents it to someone else in the group and so on until a new game emerges or a water break is needed. I think that's the metaphor for this group and the beautiful work they've done together for the past year. The gifts they offer each other keep the game going. The gifts transform the players and connect the whole group. I always leave class on Friday nights feeling transformed and energized. I'm so grateful for the gifts the students offer Karen and me. Aretha Sills, granddaughter of the goddess Viola Spolin, said to me in a class once, "What you're looking for, it's in your partner, always." Someone else said something like, "Attention is the purest form of generosity." But this group knows all that already. Their care, respect and trust in each other shines through in their work. This is a truly special team, and Karen and I are proud to be part of it.
