# Strength in Community



2022/2023 was another inspiring year at Arts Umbrella, with more than 19,000 students across Metro Vancouver and Northern Canada participating in arts education programs and performances. Of those students, nearly 15,000 were able to participate through donor-funded community programs at schools, healthcare facilities, childcare centres, and community centres.

We are proud to be an organization that engages with young people on a national level and beyond, from our Northern Arts Connection program which delivers arts education to remote communities in Alberta, Ontario, Yukon, and Nunavut, to our Creative Launchpad scholarship students who are

studying the arts at post-secondary institutions across Canada, and our Post-Secondary Dance program that draws students from across the country and around the world.

Arts Umbrella gratefully acknowledges that we continue to be supported by our community, including the many artists from across Canada who donate so generously to our Splash Art Auction each year. With typically less than 10% of revenues coming from all levels of government funding each year, we were especially grateful this year to receive a special resilience supplement grant from the Province of British Columbia through the BC Arts Council, which helped at a critical time for our organization.

We remain grateful to our incredible community of donors and supporters for their unwavering commitment to Arts Umbrella's mission to make a difference in the lives of young people through arts education. 

#### Northern Arts Connection

In partnership with Connected North, TakingITGlobal, and Cisco Canada, this live distance learning program delivers Theatre and Visual Arts programs online to schools in remote communities.

#### **COVENANT HOUSE**

This program connects young people ages 16-24 who are at-risk of (or are actively) experiencing homelessness with 10 weeks of engaging visual arts classes at Covenant House's downtown Vancouver location and Arts Umbrella's Granville Island facility. Students explore drawing and painting, clay sculpture, and stop-motion animation. The curriculum is tailored to student interests, and helps each student gain artistic, social, and emotional skills needed to succeed inside and out of the art studio.

Covenant House youth that attended the Arts Umbrella program showed noticeable benefits from engaging in the program, including increased confidence and self-esteem, as they had the chance to explore new mediums, leading to skill building and opportunities to develop and reveal their innate unique artistry. The kindness, talent and exceptional teaching and leadership skills of the instructors, Emily and Dee, truly made the experience so successful. For some of the youth who attended the Arts Umbrella classes this was their first experience of learning technical skills. Some of them were shocked by what they had created, and I often heard "I can't believe I created that." We so look forward to working together again to expand the opportunities for youth engagement and development well into the future."

#### **OPEN STAGE**

This weekly, eight-month program provides students ages 7-12 with a safe environment to learn the basics of theatre. Elements such as improvisation, movement, clowning, and storytelling give students tools to practic collaboration while enhancing self-confidence and self-expression. Each week, a nutritional snack is provided. At the end of the year, a public performance is held for family and friends. Arts Umbrella is proud to offer this program at Britannia Secondary School and Strathcona Community Centre.

This program, held at childcare centres in Vancouver and Surrey, provides young learners ages 3-5 with broad experiences in many artistic disciplines, allowing them to discover their interests. Head Start gives children an experience, a voice, and the opportunity to matter to others outside their circle. It has created lots of language and joy for the children. All children even the guiet ones - get a voice through the programs offered, visual arts, creative drama, and imagination through movement. It gives many of them an opportunity they may not experience due to family situations and living pay-cheque-to-pay-cheque. Because of certain circumstances in his upbringing, one child was very cautious with adults and rarely shared with words or touch. During a visual arts class, he put his hand up and talked about the picture with a big smile on his face. This led to the child safely expressing his wants and needs to adults around him. Our staff says Head Start shows them a different way to teach, and gives them joy to see the growth in the children."

## Foundation Program

**AUDAIN SCHOOL OF ART & DESIGN\*** 

The 2022/2023 programming year marked the first year of the Art & Design Foundation Program. Generously supported by the Poseley Family, the Foundation Program was created for students ages 7-12 who are ready for a more in-depth and focused approach to their art practice where they can build skills, discover their interests, and form a community of likeminded artistic peers.

Students choose between a Digital Media or Visual Arts pathway, taking a core group of courses that are supplemented by elective classes, teaching them key concepts of craft and technique and supporting development of a strong base of visual literacy, communication, and design.

Forty-five students were a part of the inaugural class of the Foundation Program, divided by age and art practice focus into 7 cohorts. Along with their regular classes, students

attended a field trip at the Queen Elizabeth Theatre, where they were led through a facility tour and a workshop with Queen Elizabeth Theatre Artist in Residence, Sylvan Hamburger. Students were also able to participate in two exhibits of their work: one in December in the Cassils | Henriquez Exhibition Gallery at Arts Umbrella, and a year-end exhibition at the Vancouver Playhouse Theatre, where their art will remain on display until June 2024.

# A Successful Audition Tour to the Netherlands

**SCHOOL OF DANCE** 

In 2022/2023, Arts Umbrella Dance introduced its Third Year Grad dancers to a new opportunity to strengthen their apprenticeship, audition, and touring skills. In January 2023, eight Third Year Grad dancers travelled to the Netherlands as part of a newly developed Audition Tour. The specialized Audition Tour was designed to guide the dancers in preparation for securing jobs and transitioning to professional dance careers, and proved to be a great success.









The dancers arrived in Den Haag and participated in a week-long creation period with renowned choreographer, Lukas Timulak, as well as taking daily class to prepare them for their auditions, including at Nederlands Dans Theater (NDT) II. The creation, as well as additional repertoire from the dancers' Ballet BC Annex performances and solos, were then

performed in a showcase that was widely attended by local dance artists, including the team from NDT.

The dancers displayed remarkable intelligence and determination on tour, and Third Year Grad Nathaniel Belnavis-Wright was a notable example. At the time, Nathaniel was working through a knee injury which

prevented him from being able to attend the initial NDT II audition. However, two weeks following the showcase, he was invited to attend the NDT I audition instead - a prestigious opportunity. Nathaniel was successful in his audition, receiving a contract with NDT II, along with fellow Third Year Grad, Ruth Lee.

# Half-Day Professional Training Program in Musical Theatre Performance

ROBERT M. LEDINGHAM SCHOOL OF THEATRE, MUSIC & FILM

The 2022/2023 school year marked the first year of the Robert M. Ledingham School of Theatre, Music & Film's Half-Day Professional Training Program in Musical Theatre Performance, Led by Artistic Director Andy Toth, the Half-Day Program was designed to give young actors the tools needed to be mentally and physically prepared for the demands of a career in the performing arts. Students spend a minimum of 25 hours per week at Arts Umbrella, with advanced instruction in singing and musicianship, acting tools and techniques, physical theatre, auditioning, stagecraft, and dance.

Nine students ages 13-19 were a part of the first Half-Day cohort. In addition to their rigorous class schedule, the students participated in a number of performances throughout the year, including a staged reading of the classic musical *She Loves Me*, a beautiful rendition of "Home" from *The Wiz* at Splash 2022 with Arts Umbrella's President & CEO Paul Larocque, the annual Winter Shorts Festival, and two full-length musicals as a part of Expressions Theatre Festival (*Jasper in Deadland* and *The Secret Garden*). Outside of class, the cohort attended Arts Umbrella Dance's production of *Mixed Nuts* together, as well as the Vancouver Opera production of *A Midsummer Night's Dream*.

Of the nine, the three graduating students have since gone on to post-secondary theatre studies: Jade Dy (Langara College), Kasimir MacDougall (Bishop's University), and Taea Rattlesnake (St. Lawrence College/Queen's University).

Her work is held in public, private and corporate collections all over the world.
