Welcome and thank you for joining us.





THE FORESTS WILD

By Francis Dowlatabadi April 26th and May 3rd at 7:00pm

Nine students are hiking through the wilderness of Vancouver Island on a five day camping trip. Unsupervised, the goal of their Eco program is for them to work together as a non-hierarchical collective. However, on the final day of their trip, strange noises are heard, and students are going missing. As night falls they are forced to confront one another in ways they never imagined as they discover that the forest is far wilder than they ever dreamed.

Content Warning – Flashing lights, sudden loud noises

DIRECTOR'S NOTES:

It has been a real pleasure to work on The Forests Wild, a new script written by Francis Dowlatabadi, created specifically with these students in mind. The students participated in a series of workshops with myself and Francis, reading several drafts over the past year. They were able to witness firsthand how a script evolves through the writing process. And by being active in the dramaturgy process their notes and thoughts about the characters and story have become integral to the final product you see here.

This play asks the question: What if the forest knew how we treated it? And what if it learned from us, and returned the favour?

At its heart this is a story about relationships in a variety of forms. About the pain and struggle of knowing yourself, about the risk and reward of trusting others, and about the pressing need to respect our shared environment.

In reckoning with their relationship with the forest, these nine characters learn lessons that we could all due with paying attention to.

DIRECTOR'S NOTES:

It is such a pleasure to be returning to the simple, honest and vibrant world of Dennis Foon. Four years ago, when I took over the Theatre Troupe (then the Junior Theatre Troupe) I programmed Kindness by Foon. As soon as Expressions wrapped, I knew I wanted to explore his earlier work, Seesaw. Truly the road map for his later play, Seesaw, examines what it means to feel isolated and invisible at home and how students may manifest that at school. Each character navigates this terrain in a unique way - Some take it out of their classmates, some take it out on their parents and others take it out on themselves. As an educator, I am always searching for texts that will challenge and resonate with my students. This script, and the themes it explores, has allowed students to apply the skills and techniques they have learned while instinctually understanding the given circumstances and the realities of these characters. It is such a joy to

see students really understanding and loving the material.

In the original production, all the non-grade 7 characters were represented by puppets made by Canadian legend Ronnie Burkett. In our interpretation, we wanted to pay homage to this concept while making each family unique. It was important that the POV of the four main students was highlighted, thus we see a father attached to puppet strings, a mother stuck looking in a mirror and a disembodied giant bully voice. We hope that youth and adult audiences alike will resonate with this simple story of perseverance and identity allowing them reflections on themselves.

On a personal note, four of the six actors you'll see today were in Laura's and my production of Kindness during their first year with the program. Four years later, to see their growth as individuals

and artists is so encouraging and really solidifies why we do what we do. Their understanding of the craft and ability to identify their own needs within the process is the backbone of our program. Enjoy the show!



shaping the world around them. The cast has brought this production to life through a blend of directed and devised choreography, incorporating Frantic Assembly-inspired movement. These physical storytelling elements ensure that every performer plays an active role in the world we've built together.

This production is a testament to the passion and commitment of these young artists. They have embraced not only the technical challenges of music and choreography but also the creative process of devising and ensemble work, making this Newsies uniquely their own.

DIRECTOR'S NOTES:

As a kid, I used to escape into books. At 8 years old, I devoured Little Women in one evening imagining that I was Jo March the whole time. I could see the characters and the setting so clearly and in such great detail that my world slipped away for a while and I was transported.

Before I ever saw a movie or a play, books were my earliest introduction to the magic of world building and storytelling.

A lot of people use stories to escape. For most, it's what we seek to do when we enter a theatre. But as theatre makers, we hope to push beyond escapism to affect an audience so deeply that you leave a little different than you were before you entered. In that way a theatre is a sort of Liminal Space. I've always been fascinated with liminality: the space between

"what was" and "what's next".

Teenagehood is a liminal space. It's the space between not quite a child anymore but not quite an adult yet either. Not only does our story follow teenagers navigating this awkward in-between time, but it is also being performed by teenagers navigating this awkward in-between time.

I hope their beautiful work on this fantastical story moves you to change: to do that thing you've been meaning to do, to stand up to that bully, to see something in a different light.

You are the writer of your own story.
